I have been fortunate enough to attend a quite a few classical guitar recitals and in mybook this ranks as one of the most exciting and inspiring I have been to yet.

Sanja's unusual selection of pieces in her programme starting with Anton Diabelli's 'Sonatain A Major', four movements, held me spellbound with her meticulous attention to phrasing and dynamics. This was to continue throughout the recital.

I particularly enjoyed the last movement of **Joaquín Rodrigo's Sonata Giocosa** in which Sanja seemed to inject such passionate expression with her 'rasgueado' technique that I'm sure would have had Paco Pena out in goose pimples and definitely given Juan Martín a run for his money!

After a brief interval, we were treated to Sanja's own composition, 'Campus Stella'. It was the first time she has



performed her piece in the UK.
Sanja explained to me that it was inspired during some time she spent in Santiago de Compostela in Gallicia, Spain. I instantly could relate to her piece as I also recently spent some time in this very special and magical place - throughout centuries it has been sought after as a holy destination for many thousands of pilgrims

and indeed is still so up to this very day.

To end the recital, Manuel
Ponce's Variations on
'Folia de España' and
Fugue was performed with yet

again impeccable style and technique. A long piece, but played to captivate the audience's attention throughout. However, the 'fortissimo' chords towards the end played with such musicality and precision resulted in a broken nail but Sanja returned after great applause to finish off with the delightful and sparkling Vals Venezolano, 'El Marabino' by Antonio Lauro.

A truly memorable concert and one that I will not forget in a hurry.

It was a privilege to be there when he finally did, and to hear him do such justice to the marathon work that Brahms described as "a whole world of the deepest thoughts and most powerful feelings." Also in February, we enjoyed hearing Chris Cuthbert play Jesu, Joy of Man's Desiring. And those were just the Bach highlights!

You can never hear too much Tarrega and Lauro, which is good news for **Andy**, as Capricho Arabe and Natalia are among the pieces we've enjoyed getting to know lately while he's been working up his recital programme. Thursday March 18th at 7.20pm is your chance to hear an extended set from Andy (but we promise he'll leave time for you to play, too!), so why not come along to Blandford - details from **julian@renrag.co.uk**.
