## Dale Kavanagh at Kinson

Thomas Kirchhoff as the Amadeus Duo, so we were fortunate to have her play a solo recital—her only one in UK on this trip.

We experimented with the seat layout in the hall at Pelhams and following Grant's suggestion, placed the seats to face the fire exit side, which all thought a great improvement to the usual ,and seemed to obviate the need for the dais, giving everybody a good view of the performer. As usual audience attendance was below fifty, however the new seating pattern seemed to help to disguise this, and Dale gave as committed a performance as if she was playing to a full house!

During the evening someone asked me if all our recitals were of this sort of high standard, my reply was that yes, they generally were, however this one certainly was memorable, not just for Dale's incredibly fine playing, but for a program which covered a very wide range of styles and was charmingly introduced by the artist. The opening Praetorius pieces provided a particularly punchy and melodic start, contrasting with the single Bach Allemande



(BWV 995) which followed. Although it seemed at first, strange to hear a single movement from a suite, this is one of those very substantial and powerful movements able to stand on its own, and which the artist ornamented strongly, especially the repeated sections.

As well as delightfully idiomatic and substantial works by Jaime Zenamon and Carlo Domeniconi, three sections of the recital were devoted to Dale's own compositions. These were greatly enjoyed by the audience, demonstrating some spectacular playing, and used pretty well all the resources of our instrument in conjuring up atmospheres of 'The Briny Ocean' or memorable places from her youth in Canada, almost all were programmatic in content.

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The recital also contained a long-time favourite of mine, Rodrigo's Invocation and Dance which is a hommage to M de Falla. This was played with all the bitter -sweet, bite and virtuosity required. You can find a performance by Dale on Youtube playing this very work.

To finish with, a single encore followed much enthusiastic applause, one which was just right and ideal in such skilful hands--- Tarrega's Recuerdos de La Alhambra -this was a very well-shaped performance, and needless to say, a well-controlled tremolo. Despite the number of times one has heard this piece it is still a delight when so well played.

A short reception followed with drinks and nibbles, which rounded things off nicely and gave plenty of opportunity to question Dale about such matters as the development of a good tremolo, general technique, nails and other matters of

great importance to us guitarists! Questions she must have to answer almost endlessly, but which she answered with patience as well as humour. Maybe next year we could arrange to have the complete Amadeus Duo play for us?

#### OVERWHELMED BY GUITARS

On 21 March 2015 a large audience gathered in the Boldre Memorial Hall for a concert given by the Dorset Guitar Orchestra. It was arranged by St John the Baptist's Church as a community event more than a mere fund raiser. It proved to be a revelation to us all.

#### Great fun

Few of us, I suspect, had ever heard so many acoustic guitars playing together. The instrument is more usually heard solo or in small ensembles, or as an expressive and delicate accompaniment to the human voice. It is particularly suited to doleful, intimate, Northern European expressions of romantic love, or to rather more lively, rhythmic. and sometimes frenzied Southern European and Latin American declarations of romantic love. To hear nearly thirty guitars giving it a great plunk, plonk, tink and tonk together, was wonderful. That Vivaldi's Concerto for 2 Mandolins in G (a work that always has me dancing around my study in wildly gesticulating glee) should still make such musical sense in arrangement for guitars alone, is a tribute not only to the composer, but to the orchestra as well. Great fun.

However, the real potential of the instrument and the virtuosic skill of the best of the performers was better seen in the solo and ensemble work. We were treated to an imaginative and varied program as well as some breathtakingly accomplished playing. An item for horn and for flute, accompanied by guitar, provided sensible tonal variety to the program.

#### Jewish harp and Mandora

It was a great evening, with a glass of wine and nibbles thrown in. Many thanks to a lovely and accomplished band of guitar devotees.

Peter Collinson, a member of the Orchestra, sometimes plays solo guitar during Communion at St John's. Hence our link up with the Dorset Guitar Orchestra.

Tastes are catholic at St John's. I have a penchant for the Jewish Harp as well as the guitar. An eighteenth century fellow called Johann Georg Albrechtsberger wrote a most melodious concerto for this instrument and a mandora, (a type of lute). What a twang that would add to our worship.
